Course Description

American Government is a nine week course at ELHS. Successful completion of the class is a requirement for Graduation in Henry County and the State of Georgia. The course will provide students with a background in the philosophy, functions, and structure of the U.S. government. It also provides students with the opportunity to examine the philosophical foundations of the U.S. government and how this developed. Finally, students will examine the structure and function of the U.S. government and its relationship to states and citizens.

The course will be taught using a wide variety of instructional strategies and technology tools including, but not limited to: Google Classroom, Google Meet, Slides, Sheets, and Docs. Discovery Education and Khan Academy for enhanced content and Illuminate for assessments.

Individual effort and responsibility are paramount to attaining success in the course. Students are expected to be prepared for class everyday: which may include completing homework, current events, readings, or projects. It also means that you use your Henry County e-mail and check your in-box every day.

Supplies Needed for Class

GRADING SYSTEM

- All of these requirements are set by Henry County Board of Education Policy. All grades are kept on Infinite Campus and will be updated at least weekly.
- Students' cumulative grades in the class consist of the **TERM AVERAGE**, which is made up of:
 - Assessments (summative)—40%
 - These could include tests, essays, projects, and presentations
 - Practice Work (formative)—40%
 - These could include classwork/homework and quizzes And the **FINAL EXAM**, which is worth 20% of the Course Final Average.
