<p>W3d Use precise words and phrases</p> <p>Character Collage</p> <p>Choose a character or a picture representing the character. Cut and paste the image in the center of your document. Branching from that name or picture identify (15) words or images that represent that character and the conflicts they faced in the book. See the example below this chart.</p>	<p>W1c Write an argument with a claim and evidence</p> <p>Book Recommendation</p> <p>In three (3) paragraphs, write whether or not you would recommend the book you chose and why? Write a counterclaim to those who might disagree with you. Cite from your book to help prove your point.</p>	<p>RL3 Analyze Complex Characters</p> <p>Find the Audience</p> <p>Who is the audience? Analyze (3) characters with conflicts in the text that illustrate who the author is speaking to. Who does the author intend to reach through the characters in the book? What is the message the author is sending through the character(s)? Cite your evidence for each character.</p>
<p>RL2 Determine two or more themes/central ideas</p> <p>Theme</p> <p>What is/are the theme or themes of the book you have chosen? Write a thorough analysis in three (3) or more paragraphs with two (2) examples of textual evidence that support the theme of the text.</p>	<p>RL5-Authors choice-Order of events</p> <p>Plot Diagram</p> <p>Draw and label a plot diagram based on the book you have chosen. Label the exposition, the rising action, the climax, and the falling action. Write one (1) paragraph describing each of the four events on your diagram. In your final paragraph explain how the combination of these events contribute to the mystery, tension or surprise developed in the story.</p>	<p>RL7 Analyze Multiple interpretations of the story</p> <p>Interpretation-In two (2) paragraphs each answer the following: What does the text/story remind you of?</p> <p>What do you wonder about the outcome of the main character(s)?</p>
<p>RL1 Cite Strong textual evidence</p> <p>Use Storyboard or draw a comic</p> <p>Create a comic that reflects five (5) of the major plot events in the book. Indicate the page number you found the event on. This needs to be drawn well (no stick figures) or you can use Storyboard. Write a caption that explains the significance of why this event was important to the narrative.</p>	<p>RL4 Determine the meaning of words and phrases-</p> <p>Authentic Poetry</p> <p>Write a poem (of 10 or more lines) that focuses on the struggles/conflict that the main character faces in the text. Consider doing black out poetry using a page from the story you read or an acrostic poem if you are not confident writing your own poetry (use the name of the book or the full name of the character). See an example below.</p>	<p>RL5 Authors choice-Structure</p> <p>Conflict</p> <p>In three (3) or more paragraphs answer the following: Does the main character face an internal or external conflict? Is the problem revealed at the beginning, middle or end of the text? What is the solution?</p>

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



