Transportation - Car	Wolverines will enter and exit through their designated entry and exit points each day. Classrooms	Wolverines will maintain social distancing by sitting in their designated seat each day and by wearing masks where social distancing is not possible.	Wolverines will maintain the sanitized environment by coming to school with a charged Chromebook and not sharing common chargers.	Wolverines will respect the learning area of others by not touching another Wolverine’s learning area or by leaning into their learning area.	Wolverines will arrive to class prepared and will utilize their time wisely by working to complete and submit all class assignments.
Classwork and Deadlines	Wolverines will work and complete assignments in a timely manner so that all Wolverines can master the standards for their grade level.	Wolverines will accept a challenging task as an opportunity to grow and learn through successes and mistakes alike.	Wolverines will adhere to deadlines, utilize instructional time wisely, and will turn in assignments on the designated due dates.	Wolverines will utilize the Instructional Week Ahead and learning opportunities to successfully complete and master all learning opportunities on time.
Collaboration	When given the opportunity, students will collaborate in a mutually respectful way where everyone’s opinion and ideas are equally valued. Testing	Wolverines will be provided assessments on the same days and times to ensure that all learners can access their grade level’s instruction during the 2020-2021 school year.	Wolverines will utilize the daily instructional tasks to prepare for tests, not review days and study guides.	Wolverines will maintain their instructional work and learning tasks in an orderly manner to prepare for any upcoming tests.	Wolverines will independently complete and demonstrate mastery on assessments through academic integrity, without utilizing notes, the internet, or any other secondary source on any and all assessments.

Attendance	Wolverines will be on time and ready to start the class at the designated start time for every class, every day.	Wolverines will attend class daily, as each class is a building opportunity to mastery.	Whenever sick or needing to remain home, Wolverines will participate fully in a remote learning modality.	Wolverines will present, purposeful, and powerful for every class, every day.
Dress Code	Wolverines will adhere to the Dress Code of Henry County Schools as well as the Dress Code for Union Grove Middle School (see below).	Wolverines will utilize their minds, collaboration, and actions as a platform for their voice and not their clothing.	Wolverines will come dressed so that dress code infractions will not result in distractions or a loss of learning.	Wolverines will dress for successful performance, whether it be for PE, Fine Arts concerts, or daily learning activities.
Cell Phones/Personal Technology	Wolverines will report any illness or symptoms to their teacher and Clinic Aide and will not use their cell phone to text or call a parent to avoid coming to the clinic.	Wolverines will ensure that their cell phones or technology does not create distractions or is used outside of the permission of a teacher for instructional purposes.	Wolverines will make sure that cell phones are powered off and in book bags throughout the day.	Wolverines will ensure a distraction-free learning environment where cell phones or personal technology interferes with the learning environment.

UGMS Dress Code:

1. No bedroom slippers or evening footwear is allowed on campus (rationale: this prevents students from moving swiftly and safely in case the need to evacuate the building arises).
2. No pajamas or evening wear is allowed on campus.
3. For students wearing distressed jeans, no exposed skin above the knee area should be visible while in school. Students may wear tights or clothing underneath the jeans that prevent skin from being exposed.
4. If students are wearing tights, a shirt or blouse should be worn that comes down to the student's fingertips when the student's arms are held down by their side.
5. For shorts, the length of the shorts should not rise above the student's fingertips when the student's arms are held down by their side.

Note: During Phase III and IV of Return to School Operations, students who fail to maintain the expectations of a safe and orderly learning environment, particularly those measures taken to prevent the spread of COVID-19, can be provided consequences aligned with the Henry County School Code of Conduct and can be designated back to a remote learning modality.
